One of the prayer habits I have picked up from more than one ministry or mission organization is the habit of praying for human resources to help in ministry. Luke 10:2 is a great passage in reminding us of the value of time and the need for us to ask God for

workers for the Harvest. I have heard these ministries make it a point to pray at 10:02 AM or PM for God to send workers. That is a great regular way to connect with the Lord and His plans for assistance in ministry. I want you to think about one further aspect of this prayer theme. We need to be praying Luke 10:2 regarding pastoral leadership.

Recent statistics have revealed that the median age of a pastor in a Southern Baptist church is about 58. Likewise, only 8% of churches are over 250 in attendance. The median size for a typical SBC church is around 57 in attendance. Times have really changed in our family of churches. With those realities, many churches are going to need to rely on bi-vocational pastors to fill the role of pastor. There are not a lot of younger men headed into pastoral ministry. Many of those that do are choosing church planting or being on staff of a larger church. This brings us to a prayer need and a practical application. We need to pray for the Lord to send workers for the harvest. We also need to be very intentional about asking people questions that will enable us to highlight the reality that God is still calling people to ministry. Some national ministry leaders have summed it up by saying we need to "call out the called." In the future, we will need to be creative about encouraging people to answer God's call, while making some part of their income from other sources. We have always had bi-vocational pastors. Many of them have been wonderful servants of God working out of the limelight. We need to pray today that God will continue to point people to service in an increasingly secular age. Oh, by the way, our God is a generous and resourceful God. He can call people to service. Are we capable of hearing and obeying?

We are excited to step into February and the next few months. There are exciting things going on in many of our churches. We are also looking forward to DNow, Mission Trip preparation and preparation for ministries like VBS in the coming days. It is a joy to serve with CBA churches with all the opportunities that are open to us in these days!


